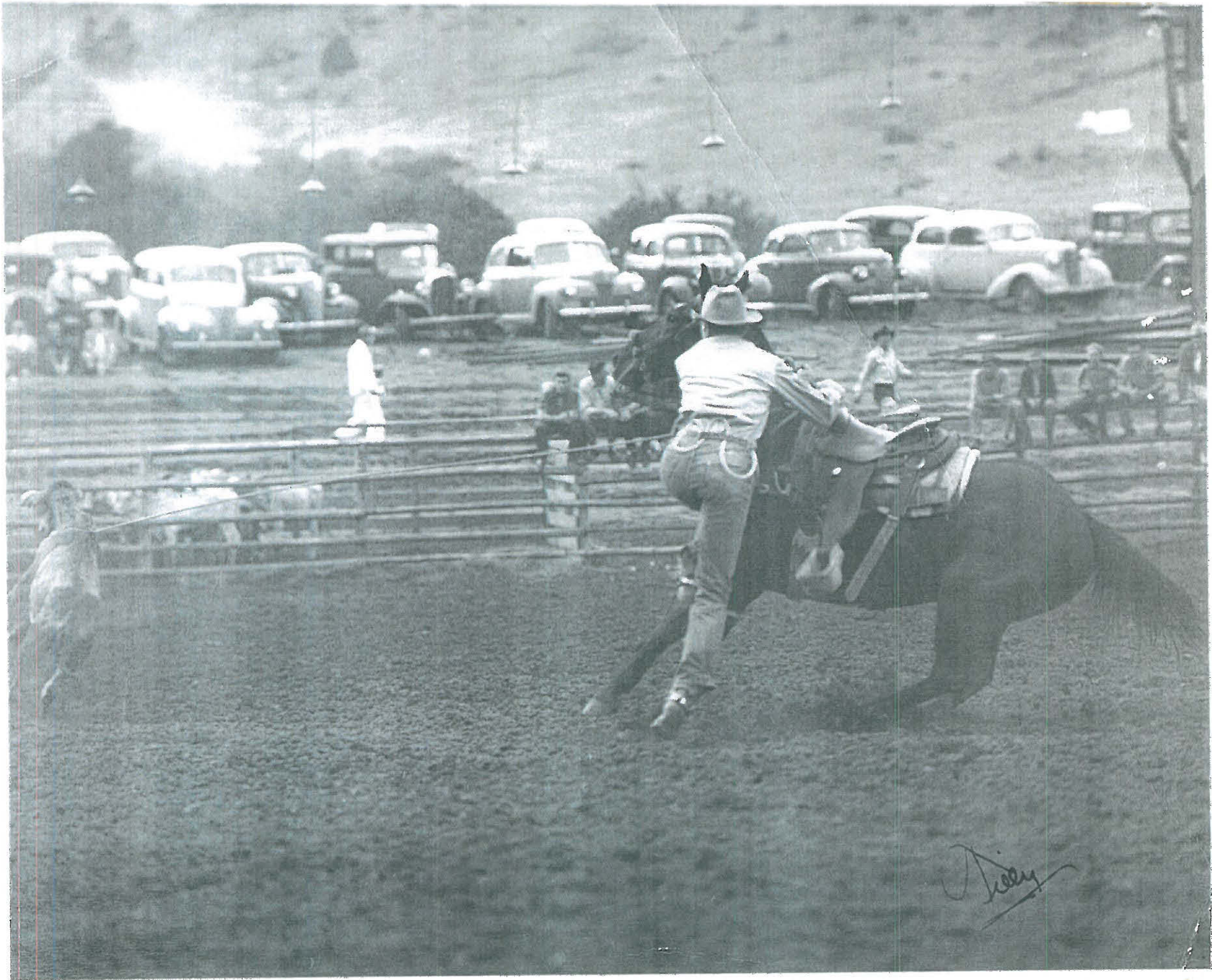

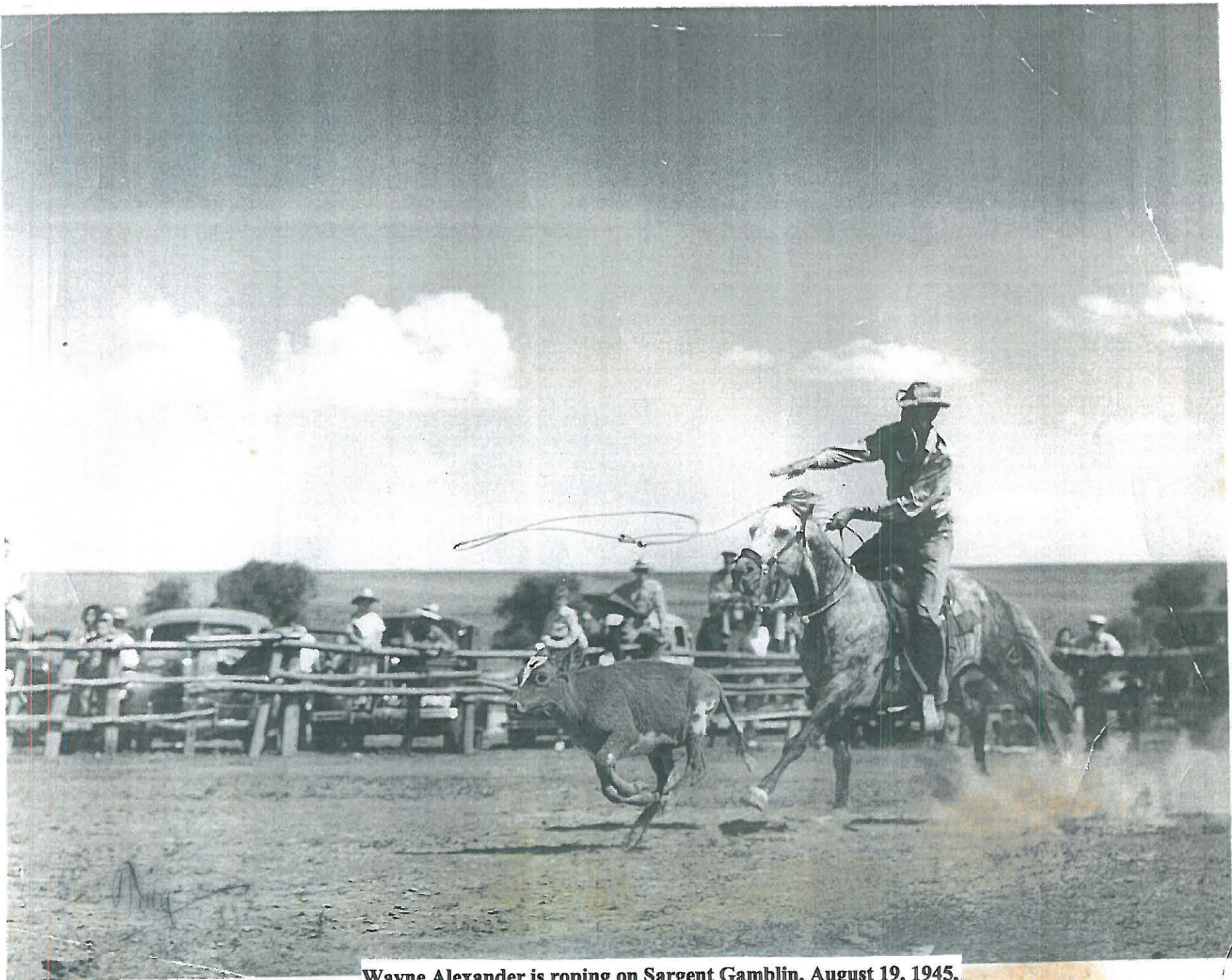

pursues a runaway calf in the tie down roping event.

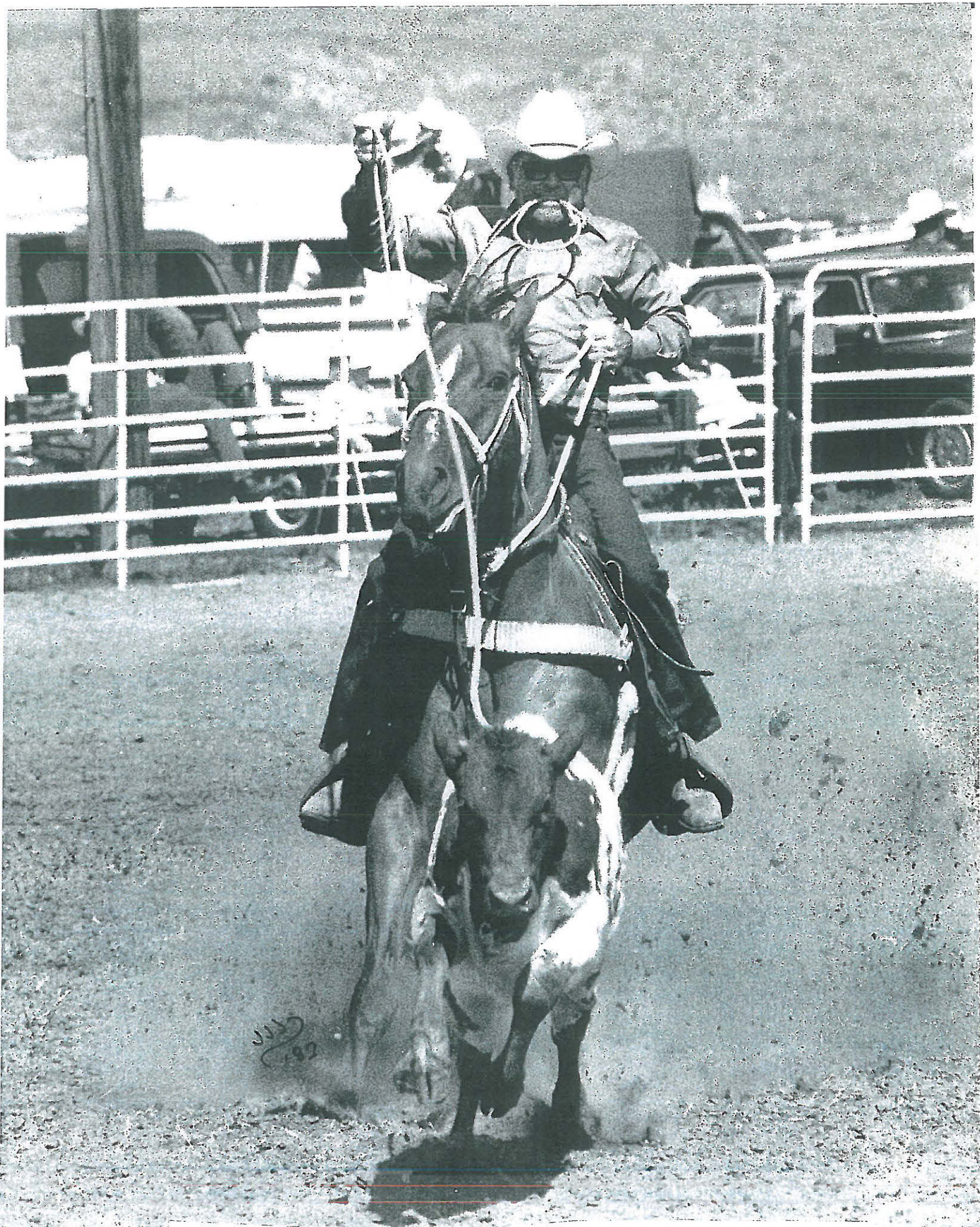


The cars parked at the mountain base verify the year as Wayne Alexander shows championship form as his ranch trained horse works the rope at a Colorado Rodeo.

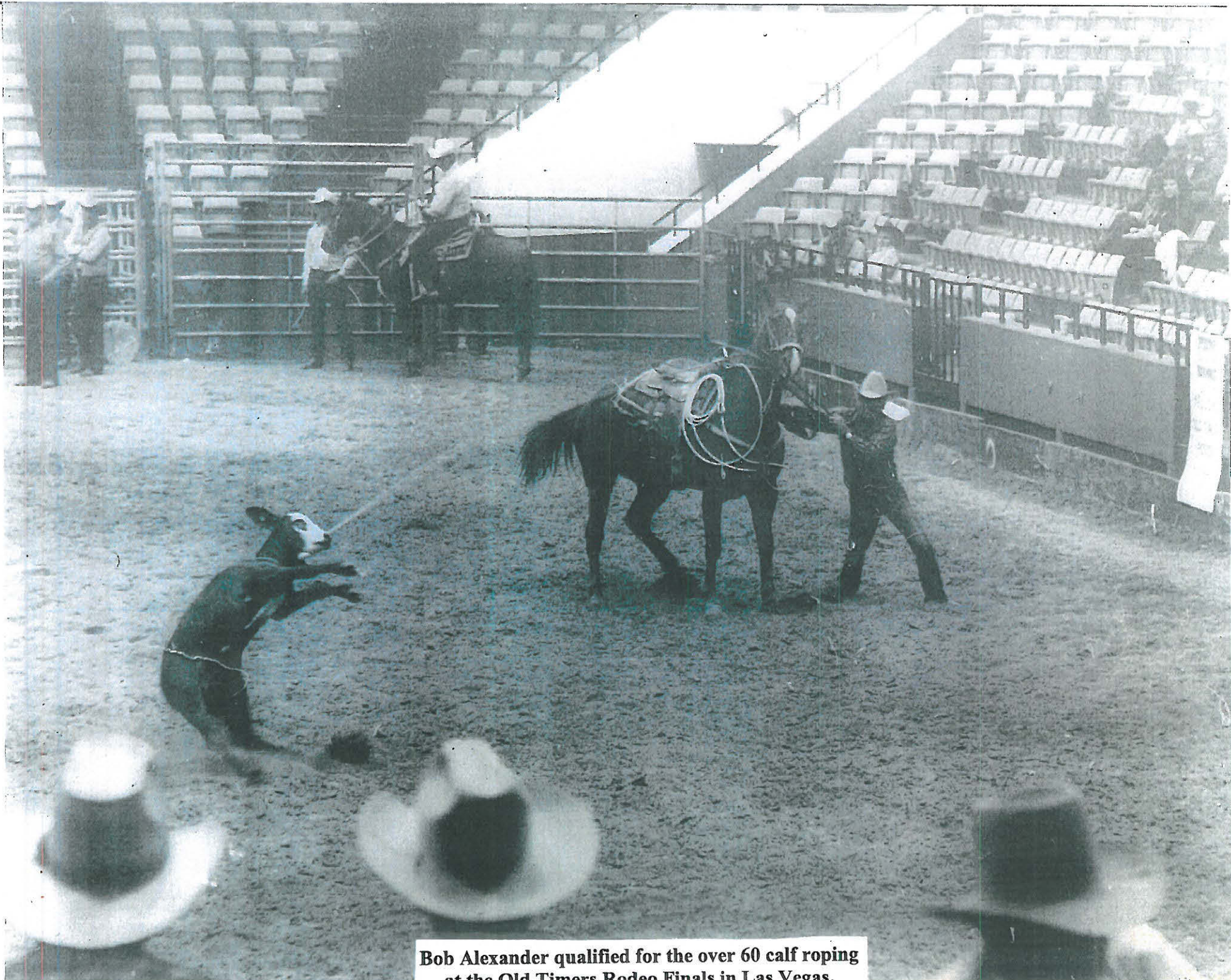

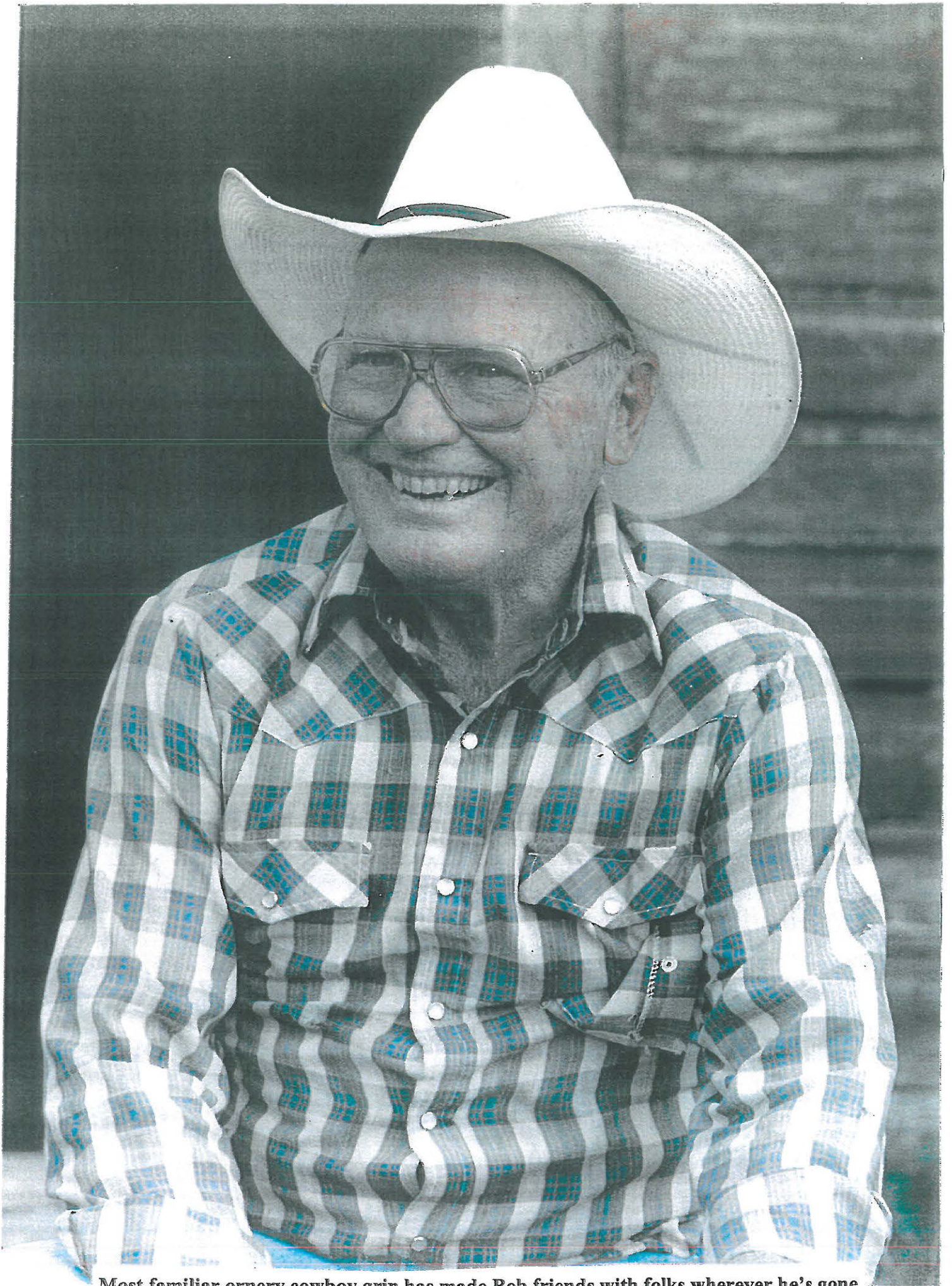

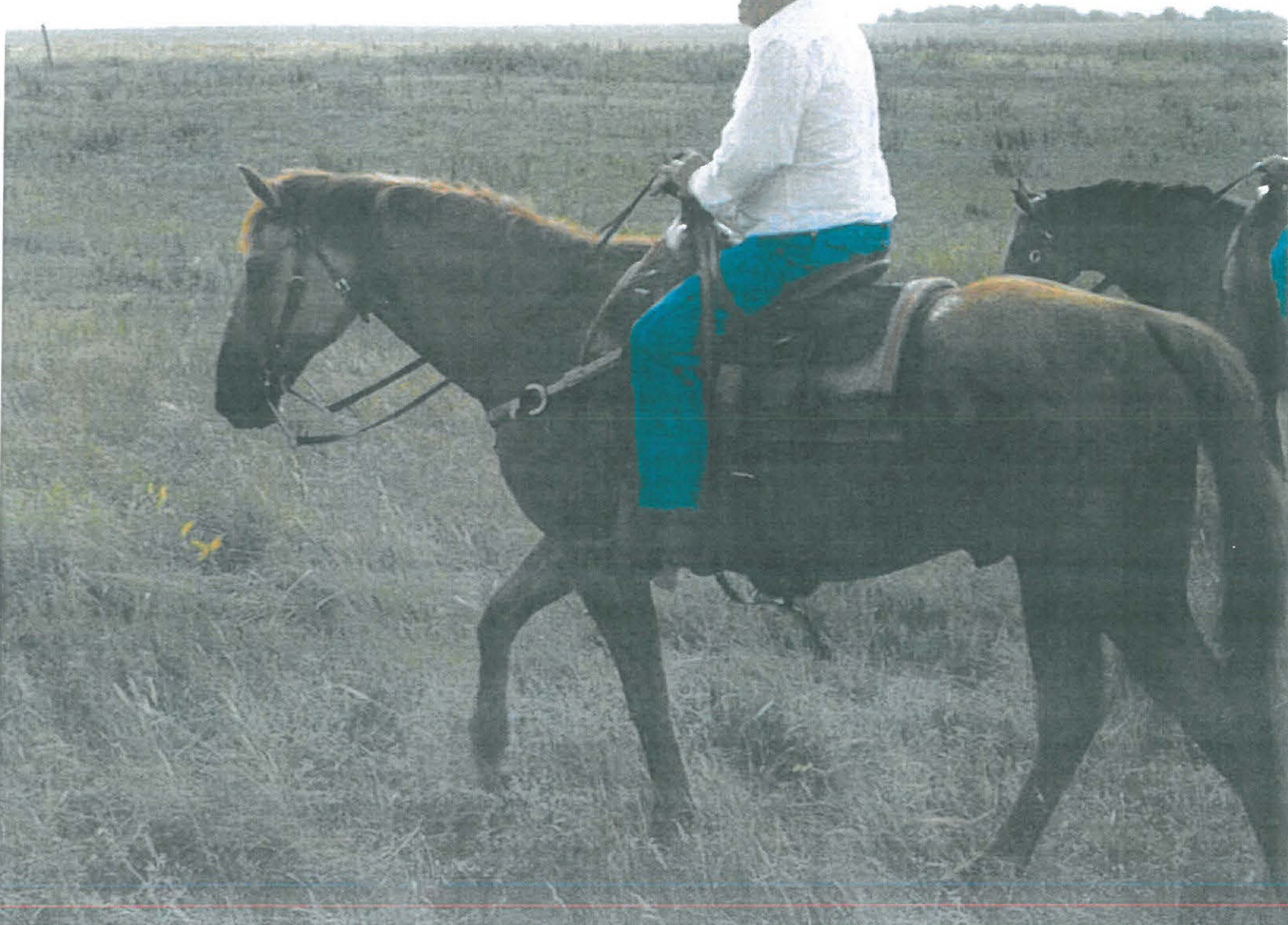
