The Topeka Farm Show is just around the corner, and Steve Guenther of Tradexpos, show coordinator and sponsor, promises the 23rd annual event to be the “biggest and best ever.”

Scheduled January 10-11-2 at the Kansas ExpoCentre, show hours are 9 a.m., to 5 p.m., Tuesday; 9 a.m., to 8 p.m., Wednesday; and 9 a.m., to 4 p.m., Thursday.

Admission and parking are free for “Kansas’s Premier Indoor Farm Show,” co-sponsored by AM 580 WIBW Radio with farm directors Kelly Lenz and Greg Akagi broadcasting live agriculture reports from the main arena all three days. Additionally, “On The Other Hand” with Raubin and Megan will be aired live 11 a.m., to 2 p.m., on Wednesday.

Advertised heavily on both AM 580 WIBW and The BIG 94.5 Country FM, the show will feature new farm and ranch equipment with more than 420 companies and a total of 690 display booths.

Nebraska Power Farming Show Sets Record With Exhibitors And Attendance

“The fifth annual Nebraska Power Farming Show in early December at Lincoln, Nebraska, featured more than 750 farm equipment agribusinesses from the United States and Canada,” according to Will Rogers, executive of the Iowa-Nebraska Equipment Dealers Association, Johnston, Iowa, show coordinator and sponsors.

“We had more than 150 new exhibitors, and by adding an additional 80,000-plus square feet, we became the third largest show in the county in terms of companies and space,” Rogers pointed out.



“The main reasons for the success and growth of the show are that the timing of the show fits the farmer’s need in purchasing items for the calendar year or for pre-booking for the upcoming spring. They also like the rural location and easy access.”

Advertised heavily on AM 580 WIBW, as it has been in the past, the three-day show had increased attendance with 15,128 people there this year.

“It was a surprise to everyone involved how great the show turned out this year,” Rogers said. “The farmers and exhibitors all seemed quite pleased.”
