Shawnee County Land Sells At Auction For \$4,400 An Acre



Real estate values remain strong at all levels, but when the quality, size and location are enhancive to several interested bidders, the prices will go higher.

Verification of that was the absolute land auction conducted by Kooser Auction Service for the Hawks Real Estate Professionals at Topeka.

A total of 35 acres of prime farmland, located on Lower Silver Lake Road northwest of Topeka, sold on a

bid of \$4,400 an acre, according to Col. Dan Kooser.

The tract, advertised on WIBW, is easily accessible to Highway 75 and 24, and is just two miles from an elevator.

Conducted at the real state office, the auction attracted a crowd of 25 people with "three active bidders." Kooser said.
