Linn County Fair Rodeo crowds will again be greeted by the new arena renovation featuring aluminium seating completed just before the 2013 fair. “Obviously, this is a huge improvement for our spectators, both comfort and safety wise,” Teagarden said.

Cowgirls’ barrel racing is also on tap for all ages.,” Rollins reviewed/

An eager group of “Little Clowns” is anxious to assist with protecting the “Mutton Busting” sheep riders at both performance and will likely providing ample spectator entertainment to boot.

“We’ll have concessions on site, so bring your lawn chairs to completely enjoy the action. Camping is welcome, too, in order to make it a full weekend of family relaxation,” Rollins invited.
